⇒ <u>Character</u> includes thoughts, feelings, desires and motives. It is words, looks, action. Character is the outward reflection of the spiritual condition of the heart and mind.


It's moving from a selfish nature, which we're born with, to a Christ-like nature. It's a lifelong process." (Dr. Kay Kuzma)

## A Child is Capable of Being Shaped

- ⇒ "A child's spiritual character will be shaped early! It will either be shaped by believers or it will be shaped by nonbelievers!"
- ⇒ By three years old: the child's basic PERSONALITY is established!
- ⇒ By five years old: the BRAIN is almost the adult size, with over half of its capacity in place.

⇒ By seven years old: the child's CHARACTER is almost a miniature of what he/she will be as an adult (Adapted from *Teaching Preschoolers* (Warrenton, MO: Child Evangelism Fellowship, 1999) p.60

I came again when years were gone' It was a mind I looked upon; That early impress still he wore, And I could change that form no more.





Four Spiritual Walls of Protection for the Family

- \* Godly Parents
- \* Sincere Love

Every child has a "love bucket" that needs to be filled on a daily basis.

Pray for their relationship with God.

That they may know the love of Christ (Ephesians 3:18)

That they may accept Christ as their Saviour as a child (II Timothy 3:15)

That they will "let the Lord have His way" in their lives (Philippians 2:13)

That they will have a heart for God and desire to worship with other believers (Psalm 122:1)

That they will be caught and disciplined when guilty (Psalm 119:71)

Pray for Godly Character (use your bookmark)


That they will develop the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5: 22,23)

That they will hate sin (Psalm 97:10)

That they will respect all those in authority (I Samuel 15:23)

That they will learn to control their anger (Ephesians 4:26)

Pray for Protection with a Hedge of Protection From the Evil One (John 17:15)



That they will obey parents (Their obedience should be immediate, complete, without negotiation and with a right heart attitude.) (Proverbs 1:8,9; Colossians 3:20) That they will accept discipline (Proverbs 3:11,12; 23:13)

That they will love their brothers and sisters (Matthew 5:22, I John 2:10) That the parents will draw our children to the Lord (Matthew 5:16)

Pray for their Relationship with Friends

That they will choose godly friends (Proverbs 27: 6,9)

That they will be kept from being led astray (Proverbs 1:10)

That they will develop firm Biblical convictions (Ephesians 4:14)

*Pray for their Future* 

That they will meet their mate at the right time (Proverbs 19:14)

That they will choose their career wisely (Proverbs 3:6)

That they will make use of their gifts, talents, and abilities to God's glory (Matthew 25:21)

I Chronicles 28: 9 (NKJV)

"As for you, my son (my daughter) \_\_\_\_\_ KNOW the God of your father, And SERVE Him with a loyal heart and with a WILLING MIND, for the Lord searches all hearts and understands all the intents of the thoughts. If you seek Him, He will be found by you."

#### 4. Word of God

They will understand the Gospel as explained through a tool like Wordless Book or Flipper Flapper

They will learn to read the Bible personally

They will see Jesus Christ as their Saviour and Friend

Their heroes will be Men of Faith (*Patriarchs, Joseph, Elijah, Elisha, Daniel, Esther, David*) They will enjoy Topical Studies (*Living God's Way*)

They will love Christian books (*The Princess and the Kiss, The Squire and the Scroll, God's Wisdom for Little Girls, God's Wisdom for Little Boys*)

**Conclusion:** Will you aim for the heart of the child for true Christian character to develop?
